Performance of Livestock and Poultry in Catanduanes 2017-2018

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PRODUCTION

The total volume of production of livestock and poultry in the province of Catanduanes for the year 2018 reached 8, 138 metric tons which was 1.45% higher than the recorded total volume of production of 8, 020 metric tons in 2017. (Table 1)

Livestock volume of production increased by 1.96% compared to the volume of production on in 2017 or from 7, 203 metric tons produced in 2017 to 7, 347 metric tons produced in 2018. Swine volume of production posted an increase of 2.38% or from 6, 475 metric tons in 2017 to 6, 633 metric tons in 2018. Carabao, Cattle and Goat volume of production declined by 2.12%, 1.52% and 2.22% respectively for the year 2018. (Table 1)

On the other hand, poultry volume of production decreased by 3.29% or 817 metric tons in 2017 to 791 metric tons produced in 2018. Chicken volume of production decreased by 4.04% or by 696 metric tons produced in 2017 to 791 metric tons in 2018. Chicken Egg volume of production increased by 0.94% or by 105 metric tons in 2017 to 106 metric tons in 2018. Duck and Duck Egg volume of production has no significant changes in 2018 compared to volume of production in 2017. (Table 1)

INVENTORY

The total inventory of livestock and poultry in the province of Catanduanes as of January 1, 2019 reached 166, 921 heads and birds which was 3.25% lower than the recorded 172, 341 heads and birds as of January 1, 2018. (Table 2)

Livestock inventory declined by 6.53% compared to the inventory on the same semester last year or from 93, 808 heads to 88, 061 heads. Swine and Goat inventory indicated a decline by 8.44% and 7.94% respectively, while Carabao and Cattle jumped by 8.33% and 4.21% respectively. (Table 2)

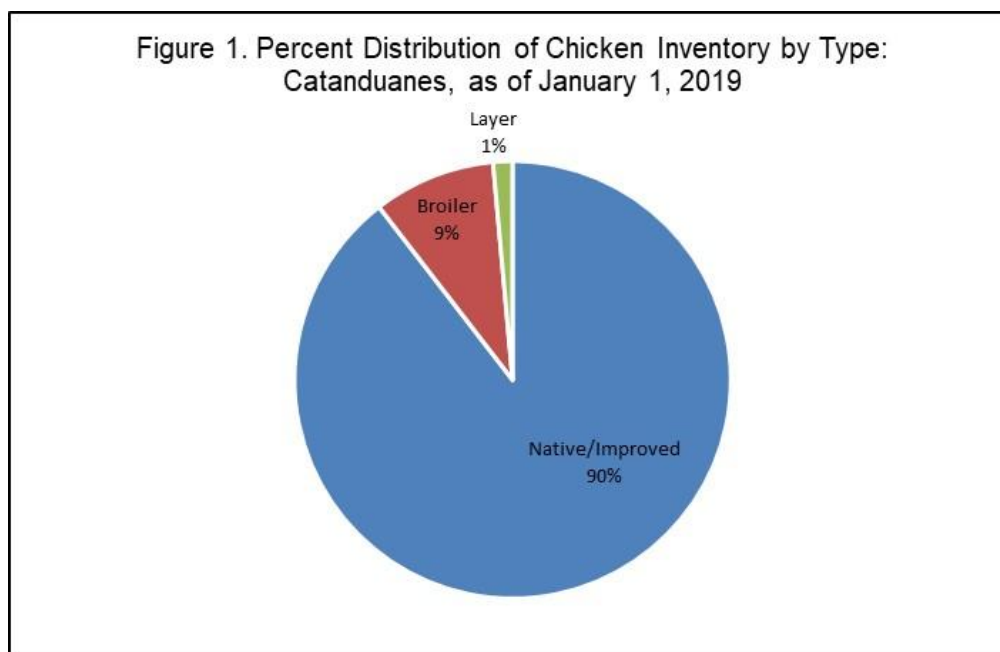
On the other hand, Poultry inventory increased by 0.41% or 78, 533 birds as of January 1, 2018 to 78, 860 as of January 1, 2019. Chicken inventory rose by 0.69% or by 527 birds while Duck inventory went down by 9.10% or 200 birds. (Table 1).

Chicken Native/Improved contributed the highest inventory with a total of 68, 625 or 87.02% of the total chicken inventory of 78, 860 as of January 1, 2019 (Figure 1).

SLAUGHTERED ANIMALS IN SLAUGHTERHOUSES

Livestock slaughtered in slaughterhouses in Catanduanes for 2018 was accounted to 8, 615 heads or 7.56% higher than the accounted 7, 964 heads slaughtered in slaughterhouses in 2017. (Table 3)

Cattle posted an increase of 17.43% or from 90 heads slaughtered in slaughterhouses in 2017 to 109 heads in 2018. Swine also posted an increase of 10.83% or from 7, 055 heads slaughtered in slaughterhouse in 2017 to 7, 912 heads in 2018. Carabao decreased by 37.88% or from 819 heads slaughtered in slaughterhouses in 2017 to 594 heads in 2018.


TECHNICAL NOTES

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The Livestock and Poultry Performance Report presents the performance situation in terms of production and inventory of carabao, cattle, goat, swine and by type of chicken; and inventory in the slaughterhouses. Moreover, data for this special release were collected by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) through the two (2) major surveys, namely: Backyard Livestock and Poultry Survey (BLPS) and Commercial Livestock and Poultry Survey (CLPS). BLPS is conducted quarterly which covers one (1) of the four (4) replicate samples of the Palay and Corn production Survey (PCPS) while the CLPS collects data in commercial farms.

Another survey that supplements the data requirements of the Livestock and Poultry sector is the Compilation of Data in Slaughterhouses and Poultry Dressing Plants (CDSPDP). This is done monthly and utilizes administrative data from slaughterhouses in the province which is in coordination with the Provincial Veterinary Office (PVO) and Meat Inspectors (MIs).

- **Livestock** – farm animals kept or raised for consumption, work or leisure. In general, poultry is separated as a distinct group of farm animals. For purposes of census and surveys, livestock covers only those that are tended and raised by an operator.
- **Poultry** - a collective term for all domesticated avian for the purpose of food consumption or, the carcass of such avian dressed/processed for human consumption.
- **Animal Inventory (also, Animal Population)** – the number of domesticated animals in head present in the farm at specific reference date.
- **Backyard Farm/Raiser**-refers to any farm or household raising at least one head of animal or bird and does not qualify as a commercial farm.
- **Dressing**-the progressive separation on the dressing floor of food animal into carcass, offal and inedible by- products.
- **Slaughter**- refers to butchering of animal for the purpose of human consumption.
- **Slaughterhouse/Dressing Plant**- the premises that are approved and registered by a controlling authority in which food animals/birds are slaughtered and dressed for human consumption.



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
