Highlights of the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (CPH) Municipality of Bagamanoc

Bagamanoc reaches 11, 086 population in 2020

Based on the results of 2020 Census of Population and Housing, Bagamanoc reached 11, 086 population count, accounting to 4.08 percent of the total population in the province.

The 2020 population of Bagamanoc is lower by 465 persons from the population of 11, 551 in 2015. This was also less than 284 persons compared with the population of 11, 370 in 2010. (Table 1)

Annual growth rate in Bagamanoc registers at -0.86% in 2020

Population in municipality of Bagamanoc decreased by 0.86 percent annually from 2015-2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality's population grew from 2010 to 2015 was higher at 0.30 percent. (Table 2)

Household population in Bagamanoc records at 11, 067 persons in 2020

Household population in municipality of Bagamanoc was recorded at 11, 067 persons in 2020. This registered a decrease of 427 persons compared to recorded 11, 494 household population in 2015. (Table 3)

Number of households in municipality of Bagamanoc was recorded at 2, 605 in 2020 registering an increase of 195 households from recorded 2, 410 households in 2015. (Table 3)

Average household size was registered at 4.2 persons per household in 2020 which registered a decrease of 0.6 percent in recorded 4.8 persons per household in 2015. (Table 3)

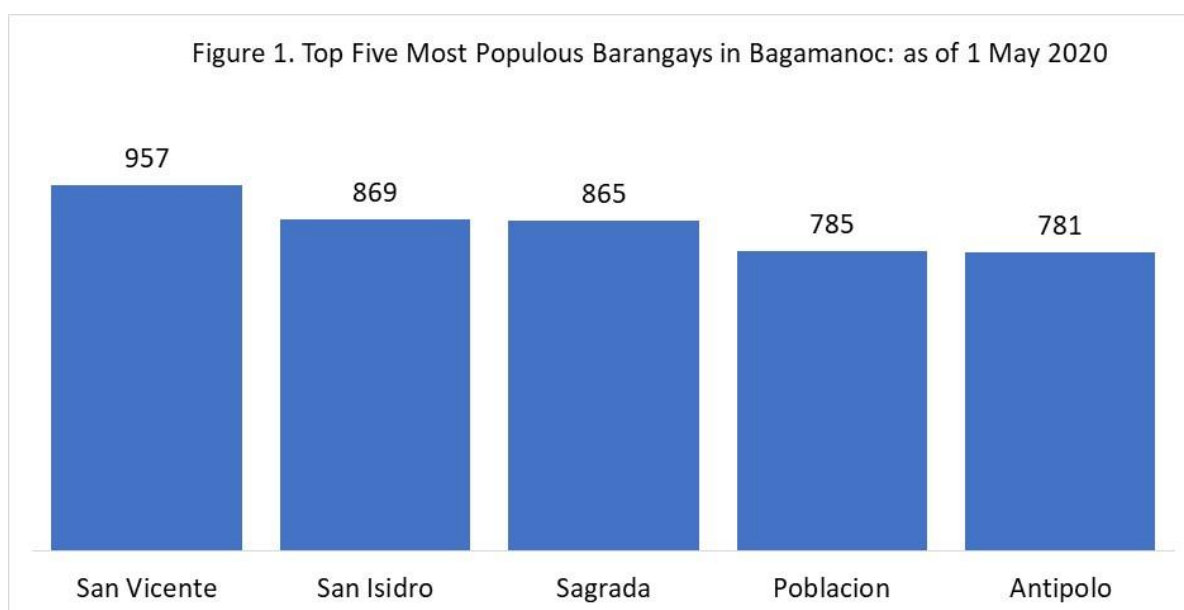

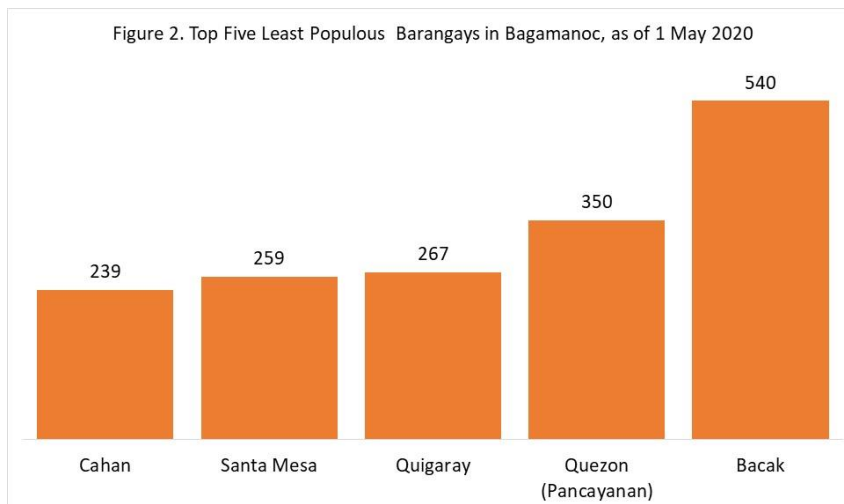
San Vicente is the most populous barangay in Bagamanoc in 2020

Of the 18 barangays in municipality of Bagamanoc, San Vicente had the biggest population with 957 in 2020. This comprises about 8.63 percent out of the total population in Bagamanoc in 2020. It was followed by barangays San Isidro, Sagrada, Poblacion and Antipolo with 869, 865, 785 and 781 persons respectively in 2020. (Figure 1)



Cahan is the least populous barangay in Bagamanoc in 2020

Meanwhile, Cahan was the least populous barangay in municipality of Bagamanoc in 2020 with only 239. This comprises about only 2.16 percent out of the total population in Bagamanoc in 2020. It was followed by barangays Santa Mesa with 259, Quigaray with 267, Quezon (Pancayanan) with 350 and Bacak with 540. (Figure 2)



Bagamanoc has the sixth highest population density in Catanduanes in 2020

Municipality of Bagamanoc had the sixth highest population density in Catanduanes in 2020 registered at 137 persons per square kilometer. A decrease of 4.0 percent was noted in population density of Bagamanoc from the recorded 143 in 2015. (Table 4 and Table 5)

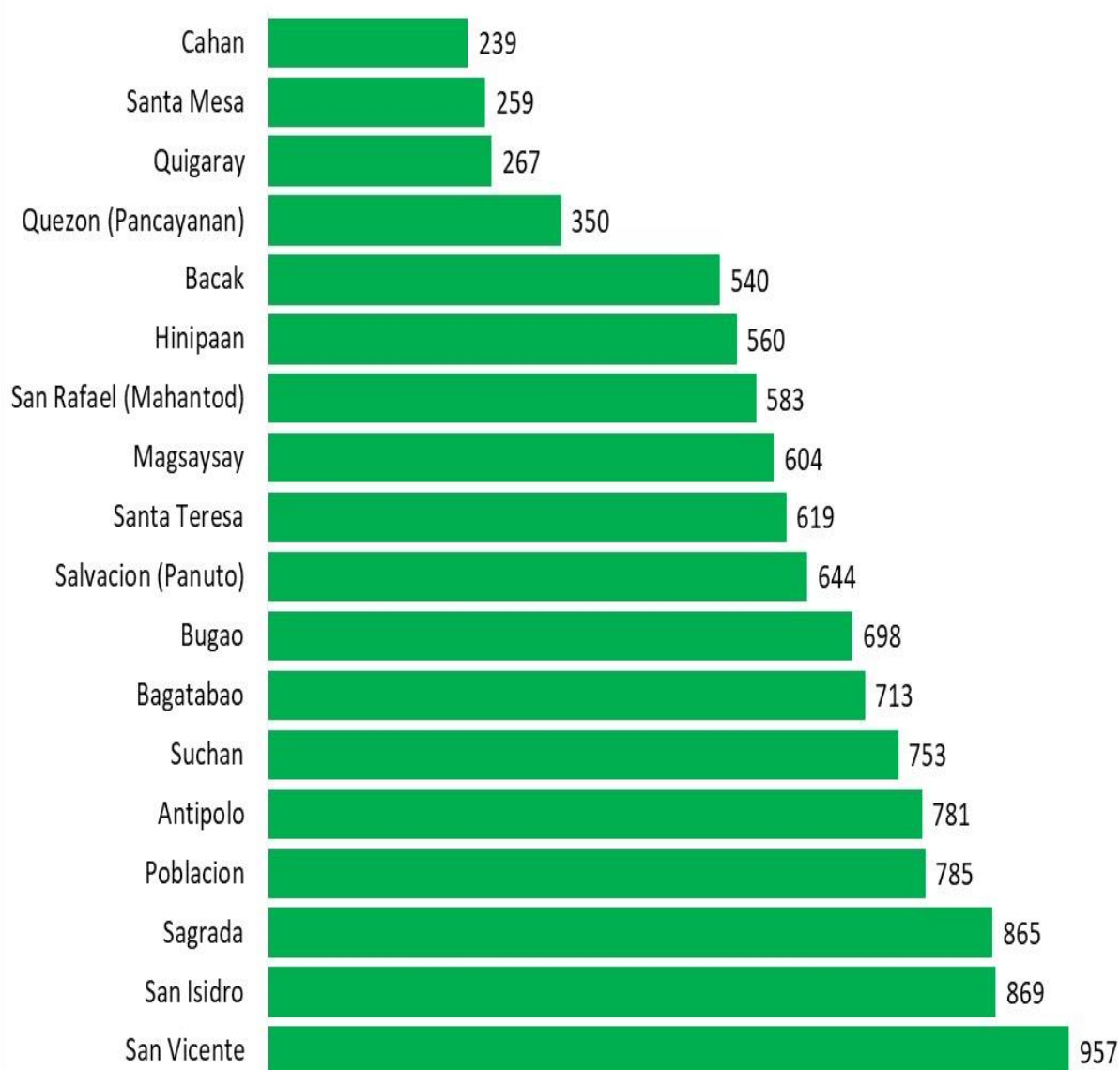
Notes: Population Density refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometer). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

TECHNICAL NOTES


The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013, Executive Order No. 352 – Designation of Statistical Activities That Will Generate Critical Data for Decision-Making of the Government and the Private Sector, and Batas Pambansa (BP) Bilang 72, which provide the basis for the decennial conduct of the integrated census of population and housing.

May 2020 was declared as the National Census Month pursuant to Proclamation No. 928, s. 2020, which provided that the 2020 CPH be conducted in May 2020, with 01 May 2020 as the census reference date. Source: Philippine Statistics Authority, 2020 Census of Population and Housing.

However, in light of the Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, the census enumeration was moved to September 2020. Information on the count of the population was collected with 12:01 AM of 01 May 2020 as the reference time and date, in accordance with the provisions indicated under BP 72.

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte has declared official for all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires administered by about 112,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census taking.

The successful completion of the census-taking amidst the COVID-19 pandemic would not have been possible without the cooperation and support of the census respondents and barangay officials nationwide. The PSA would also like to thank the members of the national and local census coordinating boards, officials of national government agencies and local government units, media practitioners, private agencies, non-government organizations, homeowners' associations, building administrators, and all other census stakeholders. Credits also go to the hundreds of enumerators, supervisors, and other census workers hired by the PSA for the 2020 CPH.
