Highlights of the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (CPH) Municipality of Panganiban

Panganiban is the second least populous municipality in Catanduanes in 2020 with 9, 713

Based on the results of 2020 Census of Population and Housing, Panganiban reached 9, 713 population count, accounting to 3.57 percent of the total population in the province. Panganiban also was the second least populous municipality in the province in 2020.

The 2020 population of Panganiban was higher by 426 persons from the population of 9, 287 in 2015. This was also less than 25 persons compared with the population of 9, 738 in 2010. (Table 1)

Annual growth rate in Panganiban registers at 0.95% in 2020

Population in municipality of Panganiban increased by 0.95 percent annually from 2015-2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality's population grew from 2010 to 2015 was lower at -0.90 percent. (Table 2)

Household population in Panganiban records at 9, 706 persons in 2020

Household population in municipality of Panganiban was recorded at 9, 706 persons in 2020. This registered an increase of 456 persons compared to recorded 9, 250 household population in 2015. (Table 3)

Number of households in municipality of Panganiban was recorded at 2, 183 in 2020 registering an increase of 172 households from recorded 2, 011 households in 2015. (Table 3)

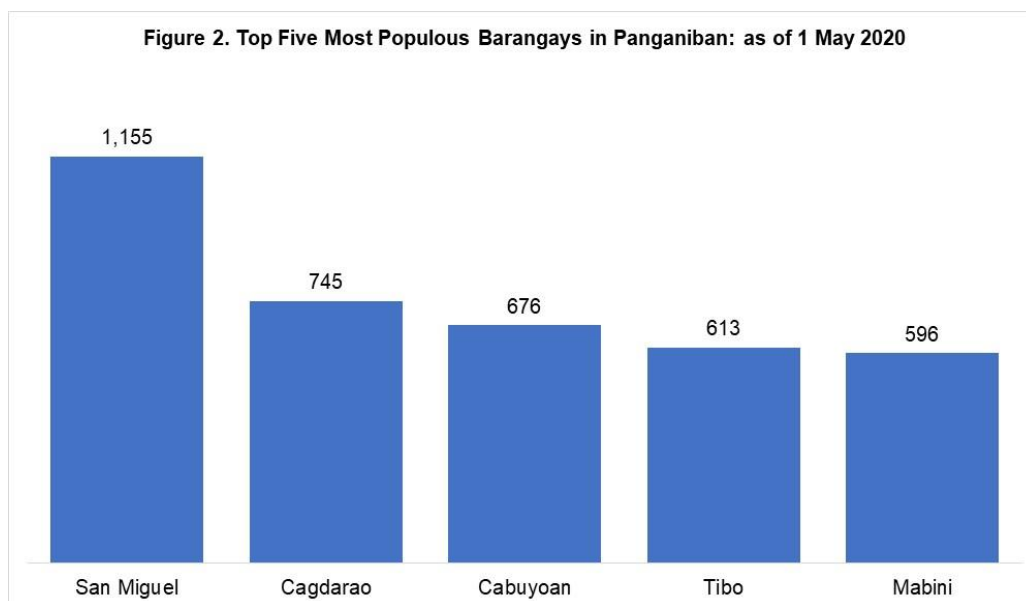
Average household size was registered at 4.4 persons per household in 2020 which registered a decrease of 0.2 percent in recorded 4.6 persons per household in 2015. (Table 3)

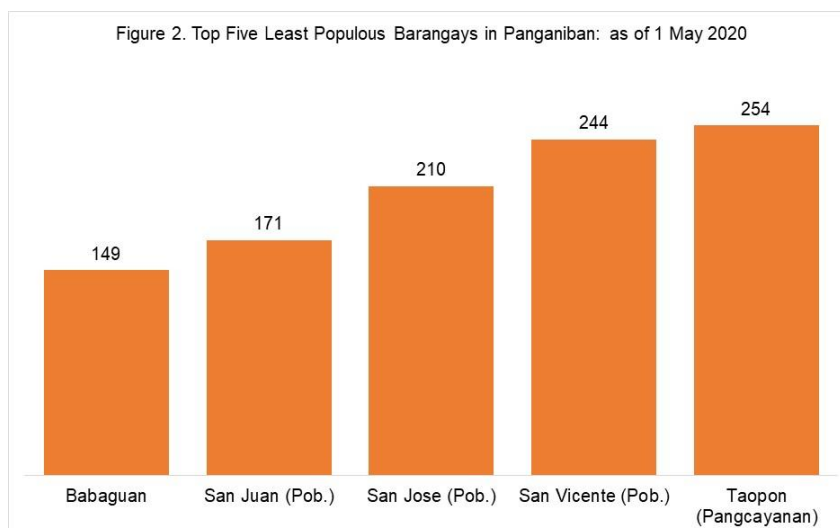
San Miguel is the most populous barangay in Panganiban in 2020

Of the 23 barangays in municipality of Panganiban, San Miguel had the biggest population with 1, 155 in 2020. This comprises about 11.89 percent out of the total population in Panganiban in 2020. It was followed by barangays Cagdarao, Cabuyoan, Tibo and Mabini with 745; 676; 613 and 596 persons respectively in 2020. (Figure 1)



Babaguan is the least populous barangay in Panganiban in 2020

Meanwhile, Babaguan was the least populous barangay in municipality of Panganiban in 2020 with only 149. This comprises about only 1.53 percent out of the total population in Panganiban in 2020. It was followed by barangays San Juan (Pob.) with 171, San Jose (Pob.) with 210, San Vicente (Pob.) with 244 and Taopon (Pangcayanan) with 254. (Figure 2)



Panganiban has the second lowest population density in Catanduanes in 2020

Municipality of Panganiban and San Miguel had the second lowest population density in Catanduanes in 2020 registered at 121 persons per square kilometer. An increase of 4.6 percent was noted in population density of Panganiban from the recorded 116 in 2015. (Table 4 and Table 5)

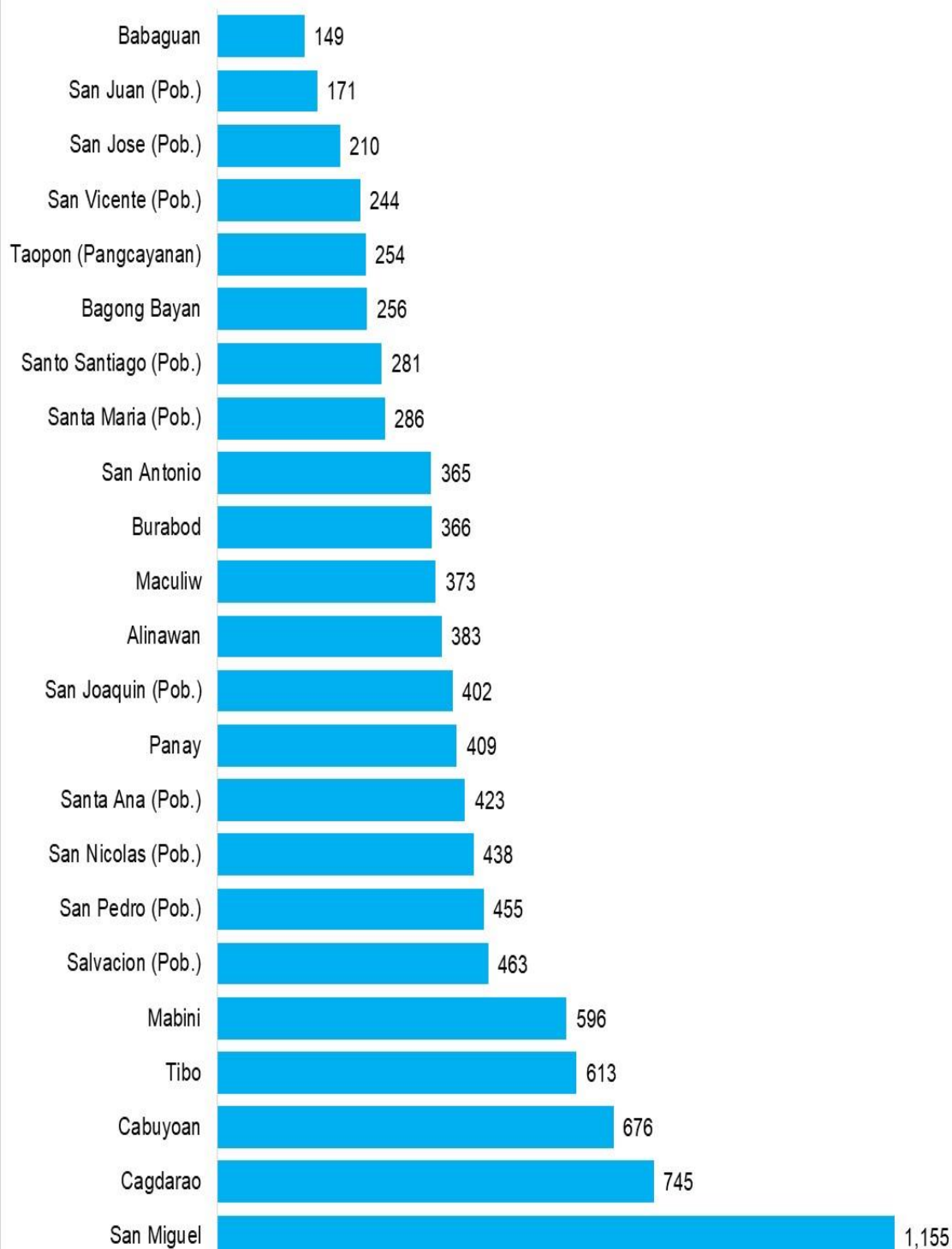
Notes: Population Density refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometer). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

TECHNICAL NOTES


The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013, Executive Order No. 352 – Designation of Statistical Activities That Will Generate Critical Data for Decision-Making of the Government and the Private Sector, and Batas Pambansa (BP) Bilang 72, which provide the basis for the decennial conduct of the integrated census of population and housing.

May 2020 was declared as the National Census Month pursuant to Proclamation No. 928, s. 2020, which provided that the 2020 CPH be conducted in May 2020, with 01 May 2020 as the census reference date. Source: Philippine Statistics Authority, 2020 Census of Population and Housing.

However, in light of the Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, the census enumeration was moved to September 2020. Information on the count of the population was collected with 12:01 AM of 01 May 2020 as the reference time and date, in accordance with the provisions indicated under BP 72.

President Rodrigo Roa Duterte has declared official for all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires administered by about 112,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census taking.

The successful completion of the census-taking amidst the COVID-19 pandemic would not have been possible without the cooperation and support of the census respondents and barangay officials nationwide. The PSA would also like to thank the members of the national and local census coordinating boards, officials of national government agencies and local government units, media practitioners, private agencies, non-government organizations, homeowners' associations, building administrators, and all other census stakeholders. Credits also go to the hundreds of enumerators, supervisors, and other census workers hired by the PSA for the 2020 CPH.
