

Inflation, All Items

Inflation in the province of Sorsogon moved faster to 2.0 percent in August 2024, from 1.3 percent in the previous month. In 2023 of the same month, inflation was posted at 3.6 percent. This brings the provincial average inflation rate from January to December 2024 at 1.6 percent. (Tables A and B, and Figure 1)

The upward trend in the inflation was due to the faster annual increase in the indices for Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels with 3.8 percent, Health with -0.4 percent, Restaurants and accommodation services with 1.5 percent and Personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services with 2.8 percent.

Meanwhile, commodity groups with lower inflation were: Food and non-alcoholic beverages with 2.1 percent, Clothing and footwear with 0.6 percent, Furnishing, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house with 0.6 percent, Transport with -1.0 percent, Recreation, sport and culture with 1.6 percent, and Education services with 17.4 percent. Other commondity groups not stated remained at the same rate.

Food Inflation

Food inflation in the province moved slower at 2.0 percent from 5.1 percent on previous month. In the same month of the previous year, food inflation was noted at 8.2 percent.

Lower annual growth rates of the indices were seen in the following commodity groups:

- a. Cereals and cereal products, 10.4 percent;
- b. Fish and other seafood, -10.5 percent;
- c. Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses, -5.4 percent;
- d. Sugar, confectionery and desserts, -7.2 percent; and
- e. Ready-made food and other food products, n.e.c., 5.8 percent.

Higher inflation were seen in the indices of the following food groups:

- a. Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals, 3.8 percent;
- b. Milk, other dairy products and eggs, 4.5 percent;
- c. Oils and fats, -1.7 percent; and
- d. Fruits and Vegetable juices, 1.6 percent.

Purchasing Power of the Peso

The purchasing power of peso (PPP) in the province of Sorsogon was at 0.79 pesos this month. This means that a peso in 2018 is worth 79 centavos in August 2024. The PPP last month and a year ago was also at 0.81 pesos.
